Close of Registration for the Primary Election is Fast Approaching

Contra Costa County—Debi Cooper, County Clerk-Recorder & Registrar of Voters announced that the close of registration for the upcoming June 7, 2022 Statewide Primary election is on **Monday May 23rd**. “This is the deadline for voters to register to be sent an Official Ballot by mail with their assigned polling place information if they will be voting in person on Election Day. After this date, voters will be required to register and vote in person.”

Register to Vote:

Voters can conveniently register to vote online at <https://registertovote.ca.gov> or complete a voter registration card, which is available at most post offices, city halls, and libraries throughout the County. Online registration must be completed before midnight on May 23rd. Paper registration cards must be postmarked by May 23rd.

To be eligible to vote in this election, a registered voter must be a U.S. Citizen, at least 18 years of age by Election Day, a resident of the state, and not currently serving a state or federal prison term for the conviction of a felony.

You must update your registration if you have moved or legally changed your name.

Check your voter registration status online at <http://www.cocovote.us> by clicking on the “My Voting Information” button.

After May 23rd, new voters will be required to register and vote in person at one of the County’s early voting sites, at the Elections Division in Martinez, or at a polling place on Election Day. Cooper’s advice: “Register early so you will receive a ballot in the mail. If you choose to vote in-person, a current registration will speed up the process at your polling place on Election Day.”
